The fact that mice can pass through quarter inch openings, approximately the size of a dime (rats can pass through nickel sized openings) makes keeping them out a very difficult task. Mice can jump, climb, and swim, making it almost impossible to prevent them from getting inside.

Identifying and Eliminating

Though mice vary in species, they all have similar traits that differentiate them from rats. Mice are small, ranging from 5-10 inches in size, while their ears are much larger in comparison to their body. Mice have a long, thin tail, and large eyes. The presence of mice may be slightly less startling than their rat counterpart, but this doesn't make them any less of a threat to your home or business.

Health Concerns

Mice and rats are associated with a number of health risks and are known to spread many diseases such as hantavirus, salmonellosis, and listeria. These diseases can spread to humans through the handling of live or dead rodents as well as contact with rodent feces, urine, and saliva. These diseases can be deadly and can put you and your family's health at risk.

If you see one mouse, it's not the only one. Mice are rapid breeders. They breed year round and one female can produce 5 to 10 litters per year. Averaging 6-8 offspring per litter. A family of 7 mice can multiply into 70 over three months.

Did you know? It is estimated that up to 20% of all fires attributed to "unknown" causes are probably started by rodents gnawing on gas lines or electrical wiring.
